Thence N56°45'40''W a distance of 677.67 feet to a point;

Thence S33°14'20''W a distance of 100 feet to a point;

Thence S22°00'W a distance of 309.2 feet to a point;

Thence S89°14'W a distance of 1304 feet to a point;

Thence S87°39'W a distance of 630 feet to a point; thence S89°01'W a distance of 1353 feet to a point in the southerly property line of the parcel.

The above-described courses are magnetic as of the year 1978.

- 4. Responsibility for the one or more pipelines to be located within the easement, including their construction, maintenance and repair, shall rest with Mobil Pipe Line Company and its successors and assigns. Mobil Pipe Line Company and its successors and assigns shall be responsible for damage caused by reason of its negligent failure to meet any of its responsibilities as described in this resolve.
- 5. The easement and right-of-way shall be of perpetual duration and shall terminate if and when the easement and right-of-way cease to be used as the location for one or more pipelines for the transportation of petroleum products.
- 6. Upon conveyance of the above-described perpetual easement any claim asserted by Mobil Pipe Line Company against the State of Maine under 1949 Resolves, chapter 62, to an easement on that portion of land from which the pipeline is to be removed shall be extinguished.

CHAPTER 29

H. P. 1412 — L. D. 1574

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Transfer of Certain Lands in Webster Plantation to the Heirs of Horace White.

Heirs of Horace White; land deeded to. Resolved: That the Director of Public Lands be authorized to convey to the heirs of Horace White all interest of the State in a parcel of land located in Webster Plantation, Penobscot County, consisting of 50 to 75 acres and being a portion of the Webster Plantation Public Lot.
