CHAPTER 298

H.P. 899 - L.D. 1178

**AN ACT to Allow Domestic Mutual
Assessment Companies to Appoint Agents.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 24-A MRSA §1531, sub-§1, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 435, §9, is amended to read:

D. Covering only title insurance; or

Sec. 2. 24-A MRSA §1531, sub-§1, ¶E is enacted to read:

E. Allowing a director of a domestic mutual assessment fire insurance company to sell property insurance coverage written by that company.

Effective September 23, 1983.

H.P. 1149 - L.D. 1514

**AN ACT Requiring Motorists to Protect
Children in Motor Vehicles by Use of
Approved Child Safety Seats.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRSA §1368-B, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 405, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§1368-B. Use of approved child safety seats

1. Transportation in vehicle of parent or guardian. When any child who is less than 4 years of age is being transported in a motor vehicle registered in this State and owned or operated by his parent or legal guardian, and the motor vehicle is required by the United States Department of Transportation to be equipped with seat belts at the time of manufacture or assembly, the operator of the motor vehicle shall have the child properly secured, in ac-
