barter of any pesticide container subject to this section, the pesticide dealer shall affix a sticker supplied by the board to identify those containers. The sticker shall indicate that the deposit has been paid and shall be designed so that it can be used to identify both the dealer and the purchaser.

After April 1, 1985, it shall be unlawful for any person to possess a limited or restricted use pesticide container subject to this regulation without a properly approved and affixed sticker, except pesticide dealers and distributors may hold containers if they are for sale and not for personal use.

6. Deposits refunded. Deposits will be refunded by pesticide dealers on all pesticide containers bearing the board's stickers at the place of business of the pesticide dealer who sold, bartered or traded the restricted or limited use pesticide or at a place otherwise established by regulation, provided that the containers have been triple rinsed or the equivalent in accord with the board's regulations prior to return.

7. Authority to adopt regulations. The board may promulgate rules and take such other actions as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

Sec. 3. Effective date. Except as specifically provided otherwise, this section shall become effective on April 1, 1984.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund for the purposes of carrying out this Act.

CHAPTER 543

S.P. 496 - L.D. 1510

AN ACT to Create the Maine Conservation
Corps.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in order for the program, as established by the bill, to function effectively it is necessary that it be commenced during the summer months when the majority of work on public lands is carried out; and

Whereas, unless this legislation is enacted as emergency legislation it will not take effect before the summer has ended; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA c. 430 is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 430

MAINE CONSERVATION CORPS

§5151. Maine Conservation Corps

There is created in the Department of Conservation the Maine Conservation Corps to provide job training and work opportunity for the unemployed on public property and to improve public property for the use and increased enjoyment of the public.

§5152. Participants

Participants in the Maine Conservation Corps shall be unemployed. No one may be eligible if he has left employment or school for the purpose of participating in this program.

§5153. Administration

There shall be a Director of the Maine Conservation Corps and such other personnel as may be required to accomplish the purposes of this Act. The director shall be appointed by the commissioner in the manner prescribed in section 5013.

The director shall work with other agencies to design the program to provide maximum work opportunities, job skills, training and improvements to pub-

licly-owned property.

In addition, the Department of Conservation shall work with the Department of Labor, including Maine Job Service, which shall conduct recruitment and referral of individuals interested in participating in the Maine Conservation Corps.

Those projects which are performed on property held by an agency which operates on dedicated revenue shall be paid for in part from those dedicated revenues.

It is the legislative intent that any project shall be of lasting and worthwhile significance to the people of the State.

Sec. 2. Evaluation and termination. The department shall report to the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature as to the effect of this program. The Maine Conservation Corps shall terminate at the end of fiscal year 1985, unless reenacted by the Legislature.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective June 30, 1983.

CHAPTER 544

H.P. 1075 - L.D. 1407

AN ACT to Equitably Share the Cost of
Police Training.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2807 is enacted to read:

§2807. Sharing of training costs

1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

A. "Governmental entity" means the State, or any cities, towns, plantations or counties.

B. "Training" means the initial basic training provided to part or full-time law enforcement
