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## CHAPTER 552

H.P. 1317 - L.D. 1746

AN ACT to Increase Funding Allocation  
for the Bureau of Oil and Hazardous  
Materials Control for Fiscal Year 1983.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, insufficient funding is currently allocated to continue the functions assigned to the Bureau of Oil and Hazardous Materials Control through the remainder of fiscal year 1983; and

Whereas, the United States Environmental Protection Agency has increased its grant to the department under Public Law 94-580, Section 3011, in order to enable the Bureau of Oil and Hazardous Materials Control to carry out its responsibilities; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Allocation. In addition to allocations made previously under the Hazardous Waste Program Support Grant, the following additional funds are allocated.
