H.P. 1477 - L.D. 1930

**AN ACT to Delay Employers' Filing
Deadlines under the Chemical Substance
Identification Law.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Legislature recognizes the importance of protecting the occupational health and safety of the workers of this State; and

Whereas, the Legislature also recognizes that the protection of workers' safety and health can and should be accomplished without placing unnecessary burdens on employers; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Transition provision. During the first program year, calendar year 1984, the deadline for employers' filings of hazardous substances with the Bureau of Labor Standards established pursuant to Public Law 1983, chapter 568, shall be February 15, 1984.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective January 13, 1984.
