CHAPTER 669

S.P. 744 - L.D. 2047

AN ACT to Clarify the Authority of the Representative of the State Registrar of Vital Statistics.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §2701, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1967, c. 186, §1, is amended to read:

5. Deputy State Registrar. The state registrar may designate an employee of the Office of Vital Statistics to represent the Office of Vital Statistics. The representative shall be known as the Deputy State Registrar of Vital Statistics and shall have the authority of the registrar in the registrar's absence.

CHAPTER 670

S.P. 825 - L.D. 2204

AN ACT to Amend the Law Relating to Wine Franchises.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

28 MRSA §667, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 572, is amended to read:

Each holder of a certificate of approval shall file with his application a list giving the name and address of each bottler and wholesale dealer authorized to distribute products of that certificate holder and designating the exclusive territory assigned to each wholesaler within the State. Wholesalers shall not sell those products to licensees outside of the exclusive territory so allocated and designated, unless previously authorized by the bureau. Sales of table wine and sparkling wine to retail licensees at the wholesale dealer's warehouse

shall be considered a sale within the wholesale dealer's exclusive territory.

CHAPTER 671

H.P. 1475 - L.D. 1936

AN ACT Concerning the Stopping of Trucks at Roadside Weighing Points.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRSA §1801, as amended by PL 1983, c. 451, is further amended to read:

§1801. Weighing points

The Chief of the State Police may designate, of his own motion or by order of the Governor, certain state police officers who will be empowered to examine loads and replace seals as provided by section 1802.

Weighing points shall may be designated by the placement of signs not less than 500 feet from approaching traffic where these weighing points are established and all these signs shall bear the words "State Police Truck Check - All Trucks Stop." These signs shall display flashing yellow lights which shall be operated at times when the weighing stations are in operation. The placement of signs shall be prima facie evidence that these signs were displayed in accordance with this section and any operator who drives a vehicle past these signs and fails to stop at the weighing point, except as otherwise directed by the police officer, shall be guilty of a civil violation with a forfeiture of not more than \$500.

Effective July 25, 1984.

CHAPTER 672

H.P. 1567 - L.D. 2076

AN ACT to Amend the Medical Radiation Health and Safety Act.
