Diamond International Corporation, International Paper Company and Lincoln Pulp and Paper Company located in Argyle, and any land acquired in Williamsburg T.6, R.8, N.W.P.; prior to January 1, 1983.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall not be effective unless, within 60 days of the adjournment of the Legislature, the Secretary of State receives written certification by the governor and council of the Penobscot Nation that the nation has agreed to the provisions of this Act pursuant to the United States Code, Title 25, Section 1725(e)(1), copies of which shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives, provided that in no event shall this Act become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature.

CHAPTER 677

S.P. 704 - L.D. 1951

AN ACT to Provide for Certain License Requirements for School Bus Drivers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §2013, sub-§1, ¶E, as amended by PL 1975, c. 589, §22, is further amended to read:

E. Must pass such an examination as the Secretary of State shall prescribe to determine his ability to operate the specific vehicle which will be driven as a school bus or any comparable type vehicle. ~~Application for such examination shall be filed within 10 days after commencement of such operation.~~ A fee of \$8 shall accompany the initial application for such the examination. The fee for subsequent examinations shall be \$5.

Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §2013, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 780, §4, is repealed.
