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## CHAPTER 728

S.P. 867 - L.D. 2358

AN ACT to Allow Municipalities to Use  
Outgoing Voter Check Lists.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, primary elections will be held on June 12, 1984; and

Whereas, some municipalities wish to employ an outgoing voter check list in that election; and

Whereas, they will not be able to do so unless this provision is enacted as an emergency measure; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21 MRSA §861, sub-§5, ¶A is enacted to read:

A. If the municipality has required, by vote of municipal officials, the use of an outgoing check list, the voter shall announce his name and, upon request, street address to the election clerk in charge of that list prior to depositing the ballots in the ballot box.

Sec. 2. 21 MRSA §1572, sub-§3 is amended to read:

3. Appointment of wardens and ward clerks. At least 10 days before the election, the municipal officers of a city shall appoint a warden, ward clerk and at least 4 2 election clerks for each voting place created by the division. Election clerks must be nominated as provided in section 532.

A. Exception. In a town, ward clerks are not appointed.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective April 9, 1984.

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## CHAPTER 729

S.P. 898 - L.D. 2415

AN ACT to Change the Titles of 3  
Policy-influencing Positions and to Establish  
New Policy-influencing Positions within  
the Department of Corrections and the  
Department of Mental Health and Mental  
Retardation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 2 MRSA §6-A, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1983, c. 344, §1, is further amended to read:

3. Other employees. The salaries of the following employees shall be at within salary range 88, step 6:

- A. General counsel;
- B. Director of finance;
- C. ~~Secretary~~ Administrative Director; and
- D. Director of technical analysis.

Sec. 2. 2 MRSA §6-A, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 452, §3, is repealed.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA c. 59, as amended, is repealed.
