Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Authorization for Department of Defense and Veterans' Services to enter agreement for telephone renovations. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Defense and Veterans' Services may enter into an agreement for a \$187,000 telephone renovation with the United States Department of Defense. Any cost of that agreement shall be paid solely from funds of the Federal Government.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 9

H.P. 15 - L.D. 11

AN ACT to Establish a Boundary Line Between the Towns of Burnham, Unity and Unity Township.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Boundary line between the Towns of Burnham, Unity and Unity Township. The boundary between the Town of Burnham in the County of Waldo and the Town of Unity in the County of Waldo shall commence at a granite monument with a brass plaque, stamped "Unity 1981 Burnham", on the westerly shore of Unity Pond, formerly known as Twenty-five Mile Pond, in the County of Waldo, which granite monument is at or near the southeasterly corner of land described in a deed from Paul Ames to Jeannette E. Greenwood, dated July 30, 1907, recorded in Waldo County Registry of Deeds, Book 288, Page 197; thence North seventy-eight degrees, thirty-four minutes, fifteen seconds West (N 78° 34' 15" W) a distance of three hundred-eleven and two hundredths feet (311.02') to a granite monument with a brass plaque stamped as aforesaid, which monument is at or near the easterly right of way line of the Belfast and Moosehead Lake Railroad; thence North eighty-one degrees, thirty-nine minutes, twenty seconds West (N 81° 39' 20" W) passing through several monuments identified on the plan hereinafter referenced, a distance of eleven thousand two hundred

thirty-eight and ninety-eight hundredths feet (11,238.98') to the approximate northeasterly corner of Unity Township in the County of Kennebec; thence continuing on the same course (N 81° 39' 20" W) passing through several monuments identified on the plan hereinafter referenced, a distance of eleven thousand two hundred forty-one and forty-seven hundredths feet (11,241.47') to a granite monument with a brass plaque, stamped "Unity Twp. 1981 Burnham", set at an angle in said boundary; thence North eighty-two degrees, three minutes, forty-five seconds West (N 82° 03' 45" W) passing through several monuments identified on the plan hereinafter referenced, a distance of six thousand six hundred and five hundredths feet (6,600.05') to a drill hole in the top of a granite pier structure located in the approximate center of the Sebasticook River. The boundary line herein is a redefinition of the boundary defined by: Laws and Resolves of Massachusetts 1804, chapter 17; Maine Private and Special Laws 1824, chapter 245 and Private and Special Laws 1868, chapter 398.

Bearings recited in the above description are referenced to true north.

The above described boundary being the same shown on a plan entitled, "Survey Plan of the Burnham, Unity, Unity Township Corporate Boundary", dated May 28, 1981, prepared by Plisga & Day, Land Surveyors, to be recorded in the Waldo County and Kennebec County registries of deeds.

CHAPTER 10

S.P. 57 - L.D. 164

AN ACT Relating to a Fund for Ferry Replacement at Frye Island.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1975, c. 138, §6 is amended to read:

Sec. 6. Reserve fund. The corporation may establish a reserve fund, not to exceed \$100,000 \$250,000, for the purposes specified in section 5, which reserve fund shall be established, administered and subject to the provisions of the general law for the reserve fund of a municipality.
