voting at the election and a majority of the legal voters of the Town of Dedham voting at the election. If either a majority of the voters voting in Lucerne-in-Maine or a majority of the voters voting in the Town of Dedham do not approve this Act, it shall not be approved.

Sec. 12. P&SL 1927, c. 43, §20 is repealed.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, section 11 of this Act shall take effect immediately. Sections 1 to 10 of this Act shall take effect upon approval by a majority of the legal voters as provided in section 11.

CHAPTER 43

S.P. 621 - L.D. 1759

AN ACT Relating to Transportation Facilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1979, c. 53, §6-A is enacted to read:

Sec. 6-A. Authority to municipalities. Any municipality which improves land or facilities, with funds authorized by this Act, may enter into exclusive leases, subleases, ground leases and exclusive operating agreements for the provision of services consistent with the operation of fish piers and airports as set forth in section 4. Any such exclusive lease or operating agreement shall be subject to review and written approval by the Commissioner of Transportation.

Effective September 23, 1983.

CHAPTER 44

H.P. 514 - L.D. 639

AN ACT to Make Allocations from the Maine Coastal Protection Fund and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1984, and June 30, 1985.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1983; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation of Maine Coastal Protection Fund. Income to the Maine Coastal Protection Fund for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1983, to June 30, 1984, and from July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule.

This allocates the Maine Coastal Protection Fund which is required by Public Law 1969, chapter 572.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1969, c. 239 is repealed.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect on July 1, 1983.
