CHAPTER 47

H.P. 1333 - L.D. 1773

AN ACT Making Additional Allocations for
the Expenditures of State Government in
Response to United States Emergency Jobs
and Humanitarian Aid Programs for the Fiscal
Year Ending June 30, 1984.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain previously unanticipated revenues are expected to be made available to the State by the Federal Government as a result of the United States Emergency Jobs and Humanitarian Aid Programs authorized by Public Law 98.8, prior to the end of the 90-day period; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Additional block grant authorizations and allocations.

A. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1670, the State may accept federal block grants related to United States Emergency Jobs and Humanitarian Aid Programs in the following amounts in addition to such sums as have been otherwise authorized:

Sec. 4. Governor authorized to accept and expend additional funds. The Governor may accept and expend any additional federal funds arising from United States Emergency Jobs and Humanitarian Aid Programs which may become available up to 25% in excess of the amounts identified in sections 1 to 3, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs. The committee shall be notified under the same provision as transfers of unexpended appropriations in Title 5, section 1585.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective June 30, 1983.

CHAPTER 48

H.P. 1334 - L.D. 1774

AN ACT to Appropriate Oil Company Overcharge Funds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
