Whereas, immediate authorization for the spending of surplus funds will prevent any unnecessary cost increase and provide immediate relief for overcrowding; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Existing surplus. Notwithstanding the Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 408, the county commissioners of York County are authorized to spend up to \$364,000 of the existing surplus for the addition to the York County jail.

Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State Government and Federal Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Act.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective March 26, 1984.

CHAPTER 72

S.P. 767 - L.D. 2080

AN ACT to Authorize the Sale of Certain State-owned Land.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sale of certain state land; authorization. The Director of the Bureau of Public Improvements, Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to sell certain state-owned real estate located on the easterly side of Higgins Street in the City of Augusta and described in detail as follows: Begin-

ning at an iron pin at the northwest corner of land of the State as recorded in Book 2505, page 202 of the Kennebec Registry of Deeds; thence on a course of N61 degrees 50 minutes west a distance of 5.00 feet to the easterly right of way line of Higgins Street; thence on a course of approximately S36 degrees west along the right of way line of Higgins Street a distance of 25.00 feet to a point; thence easterly to a point on the northerly boundary line of above the State property; thence on a course of N61 degrees 50 minutes west a distance of 20.00 feet to the point of beginning; containing an area of approximately 313 square feet; meaning to convey a portion of land conveyed to the State by John Pappanikou and a portion of the land being conveyed by Mimi Blouin to the State.

Should this land cease to be used as an entrance to the Casco Bank, fee title to the land shall revert to the State.

Effective July 25, 1984.

CHAPTER 73

S.P. 788 - L.D. 2114

AN ACT to Authorize Washington County
to Raise \$1,400,000 for Renovations and
Additions to the Washington County Jail.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. To raise money for new detention facility. Notwithstanding the Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 406, the county commissioners of the County of Washington are authorized to raise and expend a sum not exceeding \$1,400,000 to make renovations and additions to the Washington County jail.

Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. The county commissioners of the County of Washington are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums herein authorized from or through any agency or department of the State of Maine and of the United States Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State of Maine and of the United States Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Act.
