ning at an iron pin at the northwest corner of land of the State as recorded in Book 2505, page 202 of the Kennebec Registry of Deeds; thence on a course of N61 degrees 50 minutes west a distance of 5.00 feet to the easterly right of way line of Higgins Street; thence on a course of approximately S36 degrees west along the right of way line of Higgins Street a distance of 25.00 feet to a point; thence easterly to a point on the northerly boundary line of above the State property; thence on a course of N61 degrees 50 minutes west a distance of 20.00 feet to the point of beginning; containing an area of approximately 313 square feet; meaning to convey a portion of land conveyed to the State by John Pappanikou and a portion of the land being conveyed by Mimi Blouin to the State.

Should this land cease to be used as an entrance to the Casco Bank, fee title to the land shall revert to the State.

CHAPTER 73

S.P. 788 - L.D. 2114

AN ACT to Authorize Washington County
to Raise \$1,400,000 for Renovations and
Additions to the Washington County Jail.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. To raise money for new detention facility. Notwithstanding the Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 406, the county commissioners of the County of Washington are authorized to raise and expend a sum not exceeding \$1,400,000 to make renovations and additions to the Washington County jail.

Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. The county commissioners of the County of Washington are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums herein authorized from or through any agency or department of the State of Maine and of the United States Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State of Maine and of the United States Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Act.

Sec. 3. Bonds. To provide funds for the renovations and additions to the jail, the treasurer of Washington County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow from time to time upon the full faith and credit of the county such sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$1,400,000 as may be necessary, and may issue self-liquidating bonds therefor which shall bear on their face the words "Washington County Capital Improvement Bonds Act of 1984." Each authorized issue shall be payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2 years from the date thereof and not earlier than the year 1986, as will extinguish each loan in not more than 20 years from its date. The bonds shall be signed by the treasurer of the county and countersigned by the majority of the county commissioners. The county may sell these securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the county commissioners may deem proper, but at not less than par and accrued interest.

Sec. 4. Temporary notes. The county treasurer, with the approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of serial bonds under this Act and may renew the same, but the time within which these serial bonds shall become due and payable shall not, by reason of these temporary notes, be extended beyond the term fixed by this Act. Any notes issued in anticipation of the serial bonds shall be paid from the proceeds thereof.

Sec. 5. Referendum for ratification. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of Washington County. The date of submission shall be at the discretion of the Washington County Board of Commissioners, but not later than 24 months after adjournment of the Legislature. Washington County Commissioners are authorized to expend such funds as are necessary to implement the referendum.

The county commissioners shall cause the preparation of the required ballots on which they shall state the subject matter of this Act in the following question:

"Shall the issuance of bonds be authorized in an amount not to exceed \$1,400,000 for renovations and additions to the Washington County jail?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

This Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election; provided the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act equals or exceeds 30% of the total votes for all candidates for Governor cast in the next previous gubernatorial election in that county. If, at any such first election, the total number of votes cast for or against acceptance of this Act is less than 30% of the total votes for all candidates for Governor cast in that county in the next previous gubernatorial election, the county commissioners may call not more than one other such special election to be held within the time prescribed above.

The result of such elections shall be declared by the Washington County Commissioners and due certificate filed with the Secretary of State.

CHAPTER 74

S.P. 771 - L.D. 2092

AN ACT to Amend the Trustee Appointment
Process of the Cumberland County Recreation
Center to Make it Conform More Closely to New
Legislative Redistricting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1971, c. 86, §3, 2nd sentence is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

The board of 9 trustees shall consist of 2 trustees appointed from the City of Portland; one each from the following town combinations: South Portland and Cape Elizabeth; Scarborough, Westbrook and Falmouth; Gorham, Windham, Standish, Baldwin, and Sebago; Brunswick, Freeport, Harpswell, Pownal and New Gloucester; Yarmouth, Cumberland, North Yarmouth, Gray, Raymond, Casco, Naples, Harrison and Bridgton; and the remaining 2 at large.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 1985.
