CHAPTER 21

H.P. 1068 - L.D. 1400

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes
and Authorizing Expenditures of York
County for the Year 1983.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, York County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1983 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. York County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is hereby granted as a tax on York County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1983:

CHAPTER 22

S.P. 399 - L.D. 1212

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Atlantic Sea
Run Salmon Commission to Convey Salmon Smolt
to Ocean Products, Inc.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Ocean Products, Inc., proposes to establish a major industry in economically depressed Washington County, but needs salmon smolt by May, 1983, in order to commence pen-culture of salmon in Washington County waters; and

Whereas, the State of Maine, in cooperation with the United States Department of Interior, Fish and Wildlife Services, annually conducts salmon restoration programs which involve production of salmon smolt; and

Whereas, conveyance of salmon smolt raised jointly by the State of Maine and the United States Department of Interior, Fish and Wildlife Services to Ocean Products, Inc., in return for future in-kind repayment of equal numbers of smolt, would not cause any long-term disruption of salmon restoration in Maine rivers; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission; authorized to convey salmon smolt. Resolved: That the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission is authorized to convey 100,000 salmon smolt to Ocean Products, Inc., of Washington County, Maine, for use in private pen-culture operations in Washington County waters. Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission may convey 100,000 smolt to Ocean Products, Inc., only upon the following conditions.
