S.P. 180 - L.D. 547

RESOLVE, Approving the 1983 Draft
and Arrangement of the Constitution of Maine
Made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial
Court and Providing for its Publication and
Distribution.

Constitution; approval of 1983 draft and arrangement, enrollment, publication, distribution. Resolved: That the draft and arrangement of the Constitution of Maine, as amended, made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, in pursuance of the Constitution of Maine, Article X, Section 6, is approved, and that the same be enrolled on parchment or other suitable material and deposited in the office of the Secretary of State; and be it further

Resolved: That the Secretary of State is authorized and directed to cause the Constitution of Maine, as amended and arranged, to be enrolled on parchment, or other suitable material and upon final approval of the Chief Justice, attest to the correctness of that enrollment under the seal of the State; and be it further

Resolved: That the Secretary of State is authorized and directed to cause to be published in pamphlet form, subject to approval of the Chief Justice, copies of the Constitution of Maine, in such numbers as he deems necessary, and that one copy of the same be forwarded to the municipal officers of each city and town and to the assessors of each plantation within the State.
