CHAPTER 66

H.P. 1781 - L.D. 2346

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes
and Authorizing Expenditures of Knox County
for the Year 1984.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Knox County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1984 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Knox County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is hereby granted as a tax on Knox County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1984.

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized. Resolved: That the following sums, based on the county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by the county during the calendar year 1984, in the specific total amounts of expenditures for personal services, contractual services, commodities and capital expenditures for each account in the county budget:

CHAPTER 67

H.P. 1736 - L.D. 2289

RESOLVE, to Provide for a Commemorative Bicentennial Motor Vehicle License Plate to Celebrate the Bicentennial of the Town of Shapleigh.

Authority. Resolved: That the Shapleigh Bicentennial Committee established by the Town of Shapleigh at town meeting, March 10, 1979, under Article 23 of the Town Warrant, is authorized to design, distribute and sell reflectorized, commemorative, bicentennial, simulated, motor vehicle registration plates. The committee shall promulgate such rules as it deems appropriate with respect to the design, distribution and sale of reflectorized, commemorative, bicentennial, simulated, motor vehicle registration plates. No commemorative plates may be sold, distributed or displayed which are not approved by the committee; and be it further

Use. Resolved: That the commemorative bicentennial plate, as established by this resolve may be displayed to replace the front registration plate on any motor vehicle registered in this State, except truck tractors, from January 1, 1985, to December 31, 1985. The commemorative bicentennial plate may be displayed on motor vehicles, except truck tractors, registered outside the State, but operated within this State in the same manner as provided for vehicles registered in this State; and be it further

Fees. Resolved: That the price of the plates shall be determined by the committee. The funds received by the committee from the sale of the plates shall be expended by the committee for the observance of the bicentennial of the Town of Shapleigh and for other lawful purposes of the committee.
