CHAPTER 72

H.P. 1675 - L.D. 2220

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to Enter into Agreements to Supply Water to Neighbors of Pineland Center Whose Wells are Contaminated.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the water in wells of certain property owners surrounding the Pineland Center has become contaminated; and

Whereas, this creates a serious health hazard which should be remedied as soon as possible; and

Whereas, this legislation must be enacted as emergency legislation to permit the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to enter into agreements with those property owners to supply them with water; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation; authorization. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation may enter into agreements with persons owning or occupying property surrounding Pineland Center whose well water is contaminated to supply those persons with water.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
