CHAPTER 81

S.P. 705 - L.D. 1952

RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Portrait of
Honorable Lewis O. Barrows.

Lewis O. Barrows; funds for portrait. Resolved:
That the sum of \$7,500 be appropriated from the General Fund for the commission of a portrait of the Honorable Lewis O. Barrows, the commissioning of and execution of to be under the supervision of the Maine State Commission on the Arts and Humanities.

CHAPTER 82

H.P. 1720 - L.D. 2260

RESOLVE, Reimbursing Certain
Municipalities on Account of Taxes Lost Due to
Lands being Classified under the Tree Growth
Tax Law.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain municipalities have been reimbursed 75% of the tax loss pursuant to the Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 578, and there remains moneys due these municipalities; and

Whereas, certain municipalities currently need the remaining reimbursement funds due to the taxes lost; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Reimbursements. Resolved: That the following designated municipalities be reimbursed for the sums indicated totaling \$207,100.80 under the provisions
