CHAPTER 27

S.P. 16 - L.D. 9

**AN ACT to Clarify the Enforcement of Private
Septage Disposal Sites.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

38 MRSA §1305, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 383, §9, is amended to read:

6. Municipal septage sites. Each municipality shall provide for the disposal of all refuse, effluent, sludge and any other materials from all septic tanks and cesspools located within the municipality. In addition, any person may provide a site for disposal of septage. Before making application to the Department of Environmental Protection for approval of any site, that person shall first have written approval for the site location from the municipality in which it is located. ~~The municipality or the municipal officers authorized to act for the municipality, after hearing,~~ shall approve, after hearing, any such private site if it finds that the site does not constitute a hazard to the health or safety of the residents of the municipality.

Effective September 19, 1985.

CHAPTER 28

H.P. 8 - L.D. 6

**AN ACT to Allow Municipal Officers to
Appoint Deputy Treasurers and
Deputy Tax Collectors.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

30 MRSA §2255, sub-§4 is amended to read:

4. Absence. If the clerk, treasurer or tax collector fails to do so, the municipal officers may appoint a deputy ~~clerk~~ to act during his absence

Effective September 19, 1985.
