CHAPTER 79

H.P. 436 - L.D. 618

AN ACT to Assure Equitable Compliance with
the Fair Credit Reporting Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

10 MRSA §1320, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

1-A. Record retention. Copies of all disclosures made in accordance with subsection 1, shall be retained by the user for a period of at least 2 years following the date of disclosure. These records need not be kept in this State if the administrator is given free access to the records, wherever located.

CHAPTER 80

H.P. 118 - L.D. 143

AN ACT to Clarify the Relationship between a
Road Commissioner and the Municipal
Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

23 MRSA §2701 is amended to read:

§2701. Powers and duties

The road commissioner, under the direction of a majority of the selectmen, shall have charge of the repairs of all highways and bridges within the towns and shall have authority to employ the necessary men and teams personnel and equipment and purchase timber, plank and ether material for the repair of highways and bridges. He The road commissioner shall give bond to the satisfaction of the selectmen and be responsible to them for the expenditure of money and discharge of his duties generally. In the absence of a statute, charter provision or ordinance to the contrary, any decision involving the duties and respon-
