both sides of Birchwood Road, to Pinecrest Road, thence north along Pinecrest Road to its nearest point to the Boston and Maine Railroad, a line following the boundary line between 153 and 159 Pinecrest, thence on a straight line to the Boston and Maine Railroad, thence east along the Boston and Maine Railroad to its intersection with Stevens Avenue.

District Number 39, in the County of Cumberland, consisting of the municipality of Falmouth and that portion of the City of Portland to the north and east of a line described as follows: Beginning at the Falmouth-Portland boundary at its intersection with Allen Avenue; thence south on Allen Avenue to Summit Street; thence northwest along Summit Street to Jackson Street; thence west along Jackson Street to Auburn Street; thence north along Auburn Street to Hillside Road; thence east along Hillside Road to Summit Street; thence northwest along Summit Street to Abbey Lane; thence north on Abbey Lane to Crestview Drive; thence north on Crestview Drive to Bonny Street; thence north on Bonny Street to Carter Street; thence north on Carter Street to Panoramic View; thence northwest on Panoramic View to Longview Drive; thence southwest on Longview Drive to Auburn Street; thence north on Auburn Street to the Portland-Falmouth boundary; and that portion of the municipality of Cumberland enclosed by a line described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of State Highway 88 and the Cumberland-Falmouth boundary; thence north along Route 88 to Heritage Lane; thence west on Heritage Lane to Carriage Road; thence north on Carriage Road; thence east on Carriage Road to Route 88; thence north on Route 88 to King's Highway; thence west on King's Highway to Tuttle Road; thence west on Tuttle Road to Interstate 95; thence south on Interstate 95 to the Falmouth-Cumberland boundary.

CHAPTER 426

S.P. 565 - L.D. 1493

AN ACT Amending the Maine Juvenile Code to
Allow for Access to Records by
Criminal Justice Agencies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

15 MRSA §3308, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Dissemination of information. The following provisions apply to the dissemination of information contained in the records of juvenile proceedings.

A. For purposes of this subsection the following terms have the following meanings.

(1) "Administration of criminal justice" has the same meaning as found in Title 16, section 611, subsection 1.

(2) "Administration of juvenile criminal justice" means detection, apprehension, detention, conditional or unconditional release, informal adjustment, initial appearance, bind over, adjudication or disposition of accused juveniles or juvenile criminal offenders. It includes juvenile crime identification activities and the collection, storage and dissemination of juvenile crime information.

(3) "Criminal justice agency" has the same meaning as found in Title 16, section 611, subsection 4.

(4) "Dissemination" has the same meaning as found in Title 16, section 611, subsection 6.

B. Nothing in this section precludes dissemination of any information contained in the records of juvenile proceedings or other records described in subsection 5 by one criminal justice agency to another criminal justice agency for the purpose of the administration of criminal justice, the administration of juvenile criminal justice and for criminal justice agency employment, provided that:

(1) The person concerning whom the records are sought has been convicted of a crime as an adult;

(2) The person concerning whom the records are sought has been adjudicated as having committed a juvenile crime which, if committed by an adult, would be defined as a Class A, B or C crime by Title 17-A, the Maine

Criminal Code, or by any other criminal statute outside that code;

(3) The person concerning whom the records are sought has been adjudicated as having committed a juvenile crime with the use of a dangerous weapon, as defined in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 9; or

(4) The person concerning whom the records are sought has been adjudicated as having committed 2 or more juvenile crimes which, if committed by an adult, would be defined as Class D or Class E crimes by Title 17-A, the Maine Criminal Code, or by any other criminal statute outside that code.

CHAPTER 427

H.P. 1077 - L.D. 1567

AN ACT Relating to the Income Tax Checkoff for Political Parties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36 MRSA §5283, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 246, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§5283. Designation by resident individuals

Every individual resident, who is entitled to a refund under this Part, may designate that any part of that refund be paid over to any specified political party, as defined in Title 21, section 1. Every individual resident, who is entitled to no refund under this Part, may contribute to any specified political party, as defined in Title 21, section 1, by including with his return sufficient funds to make the contribution.

Each individual income tax form shall contain a designation in substantially the following form: "Political contribution: () \$1, () \$5, () \$10 or () other \$." The designation form shall include choices for political party designation of the contribution. Provision shall be made for each person
