32 MRSA §3271, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 741, §1, is amended to read:

2. Postgraduate training. Each applicant who has graduated from an accredited medical school on or after January 1, 1970 is required to have satisfactorily completed at least 24 months in a graduate educational program approved by the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education, the Canadian Medical Association or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Each applicant who has graduated from an accredited medical school prior to January 1, 1970, is required to have satisfactorily completed at least 12 months in a graduate educational program approved by the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education, the Canadian Medical Association or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Each applicant who has graduated from an unaccredited medical school is required to have satisfactorily completed at least 36 months in a graduate educational program approved by the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education, the Canadian Medical Association or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Notwithstanding this subsection, any applicant who is board certified in family practice and who graduated prior to July 1, 1974, is board certifiable, board certified or board eligible in emergency medicine and who graduated prior to July 1, 1982, shall be deemed to meet the postgraduate training requirements of this subsection.

CHAPTER 543

H.P. 1451 - L.D. 2048

AN ACT to Authorize the Remains of Specialist
4th Class Richard D. Rimiller to be
Buried in the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 37-B, section 504, appeared to preclude the burial in the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery of Specialist Richard D. Rimiller, who was recently killed at Gander, Newfoundland, in a plane crash; and

Whereas, it is vitally important to grant this exception before the burial of Specialist Rimiller; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Richard D. Rimiller; burial in Veterans' Memorial Cemetery authorized. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 37-B, section 504, authorization is granted to bury the remains of Specialist 4th Class Richard D. Rimiller in the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective February 27, 1986.

CHAPTER 544

H.P. 1324 - L.D. 1859

AN ACT to Resolve a Conflict in the Law
Dealing with the Crime of Gross Sexual Misconduct.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, during the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature, a provision of the crime of gross sexual misconduct was inadvertently amended by 2 separate bills; and

Whereas, these amendments have resulted in confusion concerning what provisions of the law are in effect; and

Whereas, it is especially important that the criminal law speak clearly; and
