CHAPTER 608

H.P. 1531 - L.D. 2158

AN ACT to Eliminate Exemptions from Jury Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

14 MRSA §1211, as amended by PL 1983, c. 202, §2, is further amended to read:

§1211. Disqualifications and exemptions from jury service

A prospective juror is disqualified to serve on a jury if he is not a citizen of the United States, 18 years old and a resident of the county, or is unable to read, speak and understand the English language. The following persons are exempt from serving as jurors: The Governor, judges, clerks and assistant clerks of courts, Secretary and Treasurer of State, all officers of the United States, judges of probate, physicians and dentists providing active patient care; and surgeons, dentists, sheriffs, counselors, attorneys-at-law and all persons exempt under Title 37-A, section 1117 37-B, section 185.

Effective July 16, 1986.

CHAPTER 609

H.P. 1429 - L.D. 2020

AN ACT to Prevent Discrimination Against Retired Maine Residents who have Previously been Members of the Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
