Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, prompt determination of the cost of the spruce budworm spray project is necessary in order to establish preproject taxes to be assessed on landowners in the Spruce Fir Forest Protection District; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Spruce Budworm Management Program cost. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 8426, the Legislature determines the cost of the 1985 spruce budworm spray project is \$3,465,000.

Sec. 2. Preproject planning cost. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 8426, the Legislature determines the cost of preproject planning activities for the period beginning October 1, 1985, and ending April 30, 1986, is \$550,000.

Sec. 3. Extension. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 8426, subsection 2, notwithstanding, the time for legislative determination of the amount authorized for expenditure for any spray project in calendar year 1985 is extended to March 31, 1985.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective March 28, 1985.

CHAPTER 5

H.P. 635 - L.D. 903

AN ACT to Make Additional Allocations to the
Department of Inland Fisheries and
Wildlife for the Fiscal Year Ending
June 30, 1985.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will become due and payable prior to June 30, 1985; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Additional allocation of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife funds. Income to the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife funds for the fiscal year from July 1, 1984, to June 30, 1985, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule.

CHAPTER 6

S.P. 20 - L.D. 24

AN ACT Concerning the Maine Maritime Academy Board of Visitors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1941, c. 37, §2, last ¶, first sentence, as amended by P&SL 1967, c. 135, is further amended to read:

The trustees shall appoint a board of visitors composed of not ~~less~~ fewer than 12 nor more than ~~16~~ 25 members.

Effective September 19, 1985.

CHAPTER 7

H.P. 141 - L.D. 166

AN ACT to Dissolve the Eastport Utilities District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1977, c. 28 is repealed.

Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Eastport at the next general or special election after passage of this Act. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

"Shall the Eastport Utilities District be dissolved?"
