CHAPTER 6

S.P. 20 - L.D. 24

AN ACT Concerning the Maine Maritime Academy Board of Visitors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1941, c. 37, §2, last ¶, first sentence, as amended by P&SL 1967, c. 135, is further amended to read:

The trustees shall appoint a board of visitors composed of not ~~less~~ fewer than 12 nor more than ~~16~~ 25 members.

Effective September 19, 1985.

CHAPTER 7

H.P. 141 - L.D. 166

AN ACT to Dissolve the Eastport Utilities District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1977, c. 28 is repealed.

Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Eastport at the next general or special election after passage of this Act. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

"Shall the Eastport Utilities District be dissolved?"

The voters shall indicate by a cross (X) or a check mark (✓) placed against the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This Act shall take effect immediately provided it is accepted by a majority of the legal voters at the election; and further provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act equals or exceeds 20% of the vote for all candidates for Governor cast in Eastport at the next previous gubernatorial election.

The results of the election shall be declared by the municipal officers of the city and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State.

Effective Pending Referendum.

CHAPTER 8

H.P. 342 - L.D. 459

AN ACT Confirming and Ratifying the Transfer
of Real Estate by the Ogunquit Beach
District to the Ogunquit Village
Corporation and Confirming the Right
of the Town of Ogunquit to Permit the
Use of a Portion thereof for Parking.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Confirmation of transfer. The transfer or conveyance by the Trustees of the Ogunquit Beach District of all property owned by the district to the Ogunquit Village Corporation required by the provisions of Private and Special Law 1941, chapter 66 and which was accomplished in 1973 is confirmed and ratified notwithstanding any provisions of general law to the contrary; and the power of the remaining Trustees of the Ogunquit Beach District to execute the 1973 deed to the Ogunquit Village Corporation is ratified and confirmed.

Sec. 2. Use of property. The requirement of Private and Special Law 1941, chapter 66, that the property conveyed in 1973 by the Ogunquit Beach District to the Ogunquit Village Corporation be maintained and used as one of its public parks shall be deemed to permit the Ogunquit Village Corporation,
