CHAPTER 19

S.P. 280 - L.D. 738

AN ACT to Annex Certain Lands to the Town of Millinocket.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Town of Millinocket voted on November 6, 1984, to annex certain lands to the town for the purpose of economic expansion and residential growth; and

Whereas, this bill is vitally necessary to establish the new bounds of the municipality and begin development; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Two lots or parcels of land; annexed to Town of Millinocket. The following 2 lots or parcels of land bounded and described as follows and situated in township A, Range 7, WELS are annexed to the Town of Millinocket:

1. A certain lot or parcel of land situated in Township A, Range 7, WELS, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at an iron pin and post in the southerly sideline of Route 157 on the town line between Township A, Range 7 and Millinocket; thence S 69° 14' 24" E by and along the southerly sideline of Route 157 1,188 feet to an iron pin and post; thence S 5° 04' W by and along a painted line 4,291.33 feet to an iron pin and post; thence N 77° 49' 46" W by and along a painted line 1,196.12 feet to an iron pin and post in the town line between the Township A, Range 7 and Millinocket; thence northerly by and along the town line 4,464 feet to the point of beginning containing 118.23 acres. Subject to the taking of that parcel of land described in a taking of land for airport or landing field dated March 24, 1942, by the County of Penobscot and described in volume 1183, page 58 in Penobscot County Registry of Deeds.

2. A certain parcel of land located in Township A, Range 7, WELS, Penobscot County, described as follows: Commencing at a point on the town line between Township A, Range 7, WELS and Millinocket and on the northerly side of the right-of-way for Route 157;

thence northerly along the town line for a distance of 5,150 feet, more or less, to the northwest corner of the Township A, Range 7, WELS; thence easterly along the north town line of the Township A, Range 7, WELS, for a distance of 1,820 feet, more or less, to a point on the north town line of the Township A, Range 7, WELS; thence southerly for a distance of 5,110 feet, more or less, to a point on the northerly side of the right-of-way for Route 157; thence west-erly by and along the northerly boundary of the right-of-way for Route 157 for a distance of 1,535 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning. The parcel containing 198 acres, more or less.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective May 13, 1985.

CHAPTER 20

H.P. 216 - L.D. 250

AN ACT Relating to Conferring Degrees by the University of New England in Biddeford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1953, c. 123, §4 is enacted to read:

Sec. 4. Additional degree granting powers. The corporation, formerly known as St. Francis College, now known as the University of New England, in addition to the powers already granted to it by the Private and Special Laws 1953, chapter 123, and amended by the Private and Special Laws 1975, chapter 137, may grant and confer through the University of New England the academic degrees of Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science and Master of Science by the appropriate action of its trustees, upon all who satisfactorily complete such courses of study as the trustees may prescribe.

Effective September 19, 1985.
