CHAPTER 21

H.P. 802 - L.D. 1136

AN ACT Relating to the Hancock County Trustees of Public Reservations.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Hancock County Trustees of Public Reservations qualify and have urgent need to become a nonprofit historical society; and

Whereas, this change in powers will result in a needed tax exemption and qualification for erection of identifying signs before the forthcoming tourist season; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1903, c. 369, §2 is amended to read:

Sec. 2. May acquire lands for free public uses. Said The corporation shall be a nonprofit historical society, and shall have power to acquire, by devise, gift or purchase, and to own, arrange, hold, maintain and improve, for free public use, lands in Hancock County, Maine, which by reason of scenic beauty, historical interest, sanitary advantages, or for other reasons, may be available for the purpose.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective May 15, 1985.
