CHAPTER 42

S.P. 335 - L.D. 898

AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1986, and June 30, 1987.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Supplemental allocation of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife funds. Income to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the next 2 fiscal years, from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986, and from July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule.

Sec. 2. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range changes which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

CHAPTER 43

H.P. 779 - L.D. 1100

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the Bingham Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1911, c. 13, §1, as amended by P&SL 1957, c. 45, §1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Section 1. Territorial limits of water district. The following described territory and the people within the same, namely: so much of the Town of Bingham and the Township of Concord in the County of Somerset, beginning at a point on the Kennebec River at the northerly line of said Town of Bingham and extending easterly along said northerly line of said Town of Bingham to the east line of the "River Tier" of lots in said Bingham; a distance of approximately 9,250 feet, thence southerly along said easterly line of said "River Tier" of lots to the southerly line of the Ingram C. Pierce farm now owned by Walter Fitch, a distance of approximately 10,900 feet, thence westerly along said southerly line of said Pierce farm to the Kennebec River, a distance of approximately 4,200 feet, thence southwesterly across the Kennebec River and land in Concord Township now owned by Walter Hughes to the junction of Route 16 and the Jackson
