CHAPTER 83

H.P. 1174 - L.D. 1669

**AN ACT to Permit the Northern Maine General
Hospital of Eagle Lake to Maintain a
Juvenile Home.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the trustees of the Northern Maine General Hospital of Eagle Lake have determined that a juvenile home should be constructed and maintained to better serve that area of the State; and

Whereas, this legislation is vitally necessary in order to clarify the hospital's authority to establish the home, so that financing needs can be properly met; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1907, c. 84, §6-E is enacted to read:

6-E. Juvenile home. The corporation may establish and maintain a juvenile home to be known as the Philip Blanchette Youth Home. For the purpose of this section, the corporation shall maintain a separate division of finance for the home, to administer matters of income, assets, liabilities and other matters of finance.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective November 15, 1985.
