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### CHAPTER 91

H.P. 1240 - L.D. 1750

AN ACT to Adjust and Allocate Various  
Dedicated Revenue Accounts of the  
Department of Environmental Protection for  
Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1986, and  
June 30, 1987.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until late in fiscal year 1986 or early in fiscal year 1987; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Department of Environmental Protection will become due and payable during the period of April to June, 1986, and immediately after July 1, 1986; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation of the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund. Allocation of the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1986, is adjusted and the fund is allocated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987, as designated in the following schedule:

This allocation provides sufficient funds for one new permanent position to staff the hazardous waste manifest system and to assist small quantity generators in compliance with the hazardous waste laws. The remaining 5 positions are existing.

Sec. 4. Allocation of the Radioactive Waste Evaluation Fund. Allocation of the Radioactive Waste

Evaluation Fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1986, and June 30, 1987, is adjusted as designated in the following schedule:
