accordance with Method B: Weighted Votes of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 301, the votes of the school committee of the Wells-Ogunquit Community School District prior to the effective date of this Act are approved and validated. The votes of the school committee which are approved and validated include, without limitation:

1. All votes relating to the calling and conducting of a district meeting referendum on September 17, 1985, for the purpose of voting on a school construction project and the related issuance of debt; and
2. All votes relating to the issuance of bonds or notes in the name of the district for the purpose of financing the school construction project.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 94

S.P. 761 - L.D. 1925

AN ACT Transferring Legislative Jurisdiction over Acadia National Park, St. Croix Island International Historic Site, Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Veterans Administration Center at Togus and the Soldiers' Lots at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Acadia National Park and St. Croix Island International Historic Site; approval of transfer of legislative jurisdiction. The United States Department of the Interior having filed with the Governor by letter dated August 9, 1985, its notice of intention to relinquish to the State that measure of its exclusive legislative jurisdiction over Acadia National Park necessary to establish concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States, and to acquire concurrent legislative jurisdiction from the State over all areas in Acadia National Park and St. Croix Island International His-

toric Site in which the United States holds a proprietary interest, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 8, the State hereby approves the transfers of legislative jurisdiction as proposed in the notice of intention.

Sec. 2. Acadia National Park and St. Croix Island International Historic Site; description of land. The existing lands so affected are as follows.

1. Acadia National Park inclusive of all lands within the boundaries of the Acadia National Park, in the Towns of Bar Harbor, Cranberry Isle, Gouldsboro, Mount Desert, Southwest Harbor, Swan's Island, Tremont, Trenton, Winter Harbor, each within Hancock County and Isle au Haut in Knox County.

2. St. Croix Island International Historic Site inclusive of all lands within the boundaries of the St. Croix Island International Historic Site, in the City of Calais, Washington County.

Sec. 3. Acadia National Park and St. Croix Island International Historic Site; concurrent legislative jurisdiction. This Act confers concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States over all lands within Acadia National Park and St. Croix Island International Historic Site as of the date of enactment of this Act, as well as all lands hereafter acquired by the United States and expressly made a part of Acadia National Park or St. Croix Island International Historic Site, so long as these lands continue to be owned in fee by the United States.

Sec. 4. Portsmouth Naval Shipyard; approval of concurrent legislative jurisdiction. The United States Department of the Navy having filed with the Governor by letter dated July 1, 1985, its notice of intention to acquire concurrent legislative jurisdiction from the State over all areas of Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in which the United States holds a proprietary interest and to relinquish to the State that measure of its exclusive legislative jurisdiction over areas of Portsmouth Naval Shipyard in which the United States holds exclusive legislative jurisdiction necessary to establish concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 8, the State hereby approves the transfers of legislative jurisdiction as proposed in the notice of intention.

Sec. 5. Portsmouth Naval Shipyard; description of land. The existing lands so affected are as follows: The Portsmouth Naval Shipyard located in the Town of Kittery in York County.

Sec. 6. Portsmouth Naval Shipyard; concurrent legislative jurisdiction. This Act confers concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States over all lands within Portsmouth Naval Shipyard as of the date of enactment of this Act.

Sec. 7. Veterans Administration Center at Togus and Soldiers' Lots; approval of transfer of legislative jurisdiction. The United States Administrator of Veterans Affairs having filed with the Governor by letter dated October 18, 1985, its notice of intention to relinquish to the State that measure of its exclusive legislative jurisdiction over the Veterans Administration Center at Togus in Augusta and Chelsea and the Soldiers' Lots at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Augusta necessary to establish concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 8, the State hereby approves the transfer of legislative jurisdiction as proposed in the notice of intention.

Sec. 8. Veterans Administration Center at Togus and Soldiers' Lots; description of land. The existing lands so affected are as follows.

1. All of the lands comprising the Veterans Administration Center at Togus, including the Togus National Cemetery, in the City of Augusta and Town of Chelsea in Kennebec County.

2. All of the lands referred to as the Soldiers' Lots at Mount Pleasant Cemetery in the City of Augusta in Kennebec County.

Sec. 9. Veterans Administration Center at Togus and Soldiers' Lots; concurrent legislative jurisdiction. This Act confers concurrent legislative jurisdiction between the State and the United States over all lands comprising the Veterans Administration Center at Togus in Augusta and Chelsea and the Soldiers' Lots at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Augusta as of the date of enactment of this Act.
