Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature to authorize the Department of Human Services to include the cost of 270 new intermediate care facility beds in its current services budget in the next biennium. It is further the intent of this Legislature that the Department of Human Services solicit proposals for new beds and complete the certificate of need approval for those 270 new beds as soon as possible, but, in any case, not later than July 1, 1989.

Sec. 2. Transfer authorization. For the purpose of this section, "surplus" means an excess of \$500,000 of General Funds in the Department of Human Services Payments to Providers of Intermediate Care Account, but in no case may such transfer in any one fiscal year be more than \$500,000.

The purpose of this request is to allow the Department of Human Services to transfer, when available, surplus funds in the Payments to Providers of Intermediate Care Account to the Medical Care Payments to Providers Account to aid in the payment of the state match for the Home Base Care - Elderly Medicaid Waiver financial program.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective April 25, 1986.

CHAPTER 134

S.P. 910 - L.D. 2277

AN ACT to Make Additional Allocations from
the Alcohol Premium Fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that the first priority of the individual departments of the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee is to maintain the funding levels of current quality and needed alcoholism services and programs. A portion of the funds allocated in section 2 may be utilized, as necessary, to replace reductions in Federal Block Alcoholism Services Grants and current Alcohol Premium Fund, prior to the funding of expanded or new programs.

Sec. 2. Allocations of Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund. Income to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the period of July 1, 1986, to June 30, 1987, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed. The total allocations shall be as follows:
