CHAPTER 60

H.P. 1454 - L.D. 2051

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of Somerset County for the Year 1986.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Somerset County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1986 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Somerset County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on Somerset County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1986:

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized. Resolved: That the following sums, based on the county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by the county during the calendar year 1986, in the specific total amounts of expenditures for personal services, contractual services, commodities and capital expenditures for each account in the county budget:

CHAPTER 61

H.P. 1484 - L.D. 2096

Resolve, to Extend the Reporting Deadlines for the Joint Select Committee on Nursing Care Needs and the Special Commission to Study the Utilization of Vacant Buildings at Pineland Center.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Resolves 1985, chapter 47, required the Joint Select Committee on Nursing Care Needs to submit its report to the Legislature; and

Whereas, in order to give the committee time to adequately prepare its report, an extension until January 31, 1986, is necessary; and

Whereas, Resolves 1985, chapter 36, required the special commission to study the Utilization of Vacant Buildings at Pineland Center and submit its report to the Legislature by January 10, 1986; and

Whereas, that deadline provided insufficient time to properly prepare such a report; and
