Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Joint Select Committee on Nursing Care Needs. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Resolves 1985, chapter 47, the Joint Select Committee on Nursing Care Needs shall submit its report to the Legislature no later than March 10, 1986; and be it further

Sec. 2. Special Commission to Study the Utilization of Vacant Buildings at Pineland Center. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Resolves 1985, chapter 36, the Special Commission to Study the Utilization of Vacant Buildings at Pineland Center shall submit its report to the Legislature no later than March 10, 1986.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 62

H.P. 1525 - L.D. 2154

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes
and Authorizing Expenditures of Hancock County
for the Year 1986.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Hancock County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1986 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Hancock County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on Hancock County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1986:

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized.
