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## CHAPTER 65

S.P. 877 - L.D. 2206

Resolve, Authorizing the Lease of Little  
Jewell Island.

Lease of Little Jewell Island. Resolved: That the Director of Parks and Recreation shall offer to Mary Cushing Anderson of Freeport, Maine, a lease of all or a portion of Little Jewell Island for a period not to exceed 20 years and for a rental fee of \$400 per year. The lease shall apply to Little Jewell Island or a portion of the island. The island is approximately one acre and located 200 to 300 feet northeast of Jewell Island in Casco bay; and be it further

Lease conditions. Resolved: That the lease shall specify the conditions upon which the offer is made

which may include approved uses of the island and activities allowed on the island. The lessee may not be authorized to charge any fee, rent or other charge to the general public for any use of any part of the island. The lessee may not be authorized to sublease any part of the island. In the event that Mary Cushing Anderson fails to comply with the terms of the lease, the Bureau of Parks and Recreation may terminate the lease; and be it further

**Right of Succession. Resolved:** That in the event of the death of Mary Cushing Anderson prior to the termination of the 20-year lease, the Director of Parks and Recreation shall offer to David Cushing, son of Mary Cushing Anderson, the lease to the island on the same conditions and terms, including the annual lease fee of \$400, that apply to the lease signed by Mary Cushing Anderson. The lease to David Cushing shall be only for the unexpired period of the lease to Mary Cushing Anderson. The Bureau of Parks and Recreation, following expiration of the lease, may not renew the lease.

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## CHAPTER 66

S.P. 881 - L.D. 2216

**Resolve, Reimbursing Certain Municipalities on  
Account of Taxes Lost Due to Lands  
being Classified under the Maine Tree  
Growth Tax Law.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain municipalities have been reimbursed 75% of the tax loss pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 578, and there remains money due these municipalities; and

Whereas, certain municipalities currently need the remaining reimbursement funds due to the taxes lost; and

Whereas, 65 municipalities did not meet the 1985 municipal valuation return filing date or did not
