CHAPTER 79

H.P. 1682 - L.D. 2369

Resolve, for Laying of the County Taxes and
Authorizing Expenditures of
Washington County for the Year 1986
and Authorizing the County to Raise
up to \$700,000 for Jail Renovations.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Washington County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1986 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

PART A

Sec. 1. Washington County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on Washington County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized

herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1986:

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized.
Resolved: That the following sums, based on the county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by the county during the calendar year 1986, in the specific total amounts of expenditures for personal services, contractual services, commodities and capital expenditures for each account in the county budget:

Sec. 1. Additional bond issue for jail renovations authorized. Resolved: That notwith-

standing the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 404 and 406, and in addition to the amount authorized to be raised and expended under Private and Special Law 1983, chapter 73, the county commissioners of the County of Washington are authorized to raise and expend, by issuing bonds or notes, an additional sum not exceeding \$700,000 to make renovations and additions to the Washington County jail; and be it further

Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. Resolved: That the county commissioners of Washington County are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums authorized in this Part from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Part; and be it further

Sec. 3. Bonds. Resolved: That to provide funds for the renovations and additions to the jail, the treasurer of Washington County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow from time to time upon the full faith and credit of the county such sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$700,000 as may be necessary and may issue self-liquidating bonds therefor which shall bear on their face the words "Washington County Capital Improvement Bonds Act of 1986." Each authorized issue shall be payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2 years from the date thereof and not earlier than the year 1988, as will extinguish each loan in not more than 20 years from its date. The bonds shall be signed by the treasurer of the county and countersigned by the chairman of the county commissioners. The bonds shall be valid without first obtaining the consent of the county, as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 302 and 404. The county may sell these securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the county commissioners may deem proper, but at not less than par and accrued interest; and be it further

Sec. 4. Temporary notes. Resolved: That the county treasurer, with the approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of bonds under this Part and may renew the same, but the time within which these bonds shall become due and payable shall not, by reason of these temporary notes, be extended beyond the term fixed by this Part. Any notes issued

in anticipation of the bonds shall be paid from the proceeds of the bonds; and be it further

Sec. 5. Issuance and expenditure. Resolved: That if any bonds have not been issued within 5 years of the effective date of this resolve, those bonds shall not be issued. If any proceeds from the sale of the bonds have not been expended within 10 years after the date of sale, those proceeds shall lapse to the county's debt service account; and be it further

Sec. 6. No referendum required. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 302 and 404, this Part shall become valid upon enactment without being submitted to the voters of Washington County.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 80

S.P. 923 - L.D. 2300

Resolve, Authorizing the Commissioner of Finance and Administration to Convey, by Sale, the Title and Interest of the State in Land Located in Windham, County of Cumberland.

Sec. 1. The Commissioner of Finance and Administration may convey land. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Finance and Administration may convey in the form of a quitclaim deed, to the Maine State Society for the Protection of Animals, the title and interest of the State to approximately 124 acres of land, together with the buildings thereon, for no less than the appraised market value of the land and which land is now leased to the Maine State Society for the Protection of Animals under the 45-year lease, authorized by Resolve 1973, chapter 81, which is located in Windham, County of Cumberland. The appraisal of the land shall be conducted by a qualified real estate appraiser. The appraised market value means the total value or price at which the property could be sold in the private sector for the highest and best use of the property. The boundaries of the land to be conveyed are more particularly described as follow:
