CHAPTER 40

S.P. 627 — L.D. 1848

AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1987; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Supplemental allocation of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife funds. Income to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for the fiscal years from July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988, and from July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations

may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range changes which have been approved by the Department of Administration and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 4. Encumbered balances at year-end. At the end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances shall not be carried more than once.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect on July 1, 1987.

CHAPTER 41

H.P. 1208 — L.D. 1648

AN ACT Relating to Powers of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Maritime Academy and to Authorize Conferral of the Master of Science Degree in Maritime Management.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1941, c. 37, §2, first ¶, as amended by P&SL 1983, c. 16, §1, is further amended by adding after the 2nd sentence a new sentence to read:

The trustees may further provide for the publication of scholarly writings in the field of maritime and related studies and, in furtherance of that end, they may establish the Maine Maritime Press.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1941, c. 37, §8, 2nd sentence, as enacted by P&SL 1983, c. 16, §2, is amended to read:

The board of trustees shall have the power to confer the degree of Master of Science in Maritime Management upon all candidates who shall satisfactorily complete a minimum of 50 credit hours of post baccalaureate studies all post baccalaureate degree requirements in the fields of the maritime sciences in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the board of trustees.

CHAPTER 42

S.P. 231 — L.D. 625

AN ACT to Authorize the Construction of an East-West Highway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
