CHAPTER 123

S.P. 771 — L.D. 2028

AN ACT to Appropriate Funds for Structural Repairs to the Woodbury Pond Dam.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, DEPARTMENT OF

Public Dam Repairs	
All Other	\$17,500
Provides funds for repairs of a public dam at Woodbury Pond which controls the water levels on Tacoma Lakes. These funds shall be matched at the local level on a one-to-one basis. No state funds shall be expended until the local match has been provided.

CHAPTER 124

H.P. 1798 — L.D. 2462

AN ACT Making Allocations Related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of certain departments will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1988; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation of Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund. Income to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for fiscal year 1988-89 shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:
