Sec. 4. Report. The commission shall report to the 113th Legislature by December 1, 1988, on its progress in making contact with veterans and in establishing a registry. The commission shall make written recommendations and proposals as to how the registry should be made an ongoing activity of State Government and how the social services provided to affected veterans could be improved.

Sec. 5. Meetings. The commission shall meet as necessary to complete the tasks assigned the commission.

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. The commission shall request from the Legislative Council sufficient staff assistance to carry out these duties and may hire outside consultants to conduct all or portions of the study if the commission so chooses.

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. All members of the commission shall receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses.

Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Sec. 9. Sunset. This Act is repealed on January 15, 1989.
