RESOLVES

OF THE

FIRST REGULAR SESSION

ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTEENTH LEGISLATURE

after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, 1987 is the bicentennial of the establishment of the Town of Waterboro; and

Whereas, the Town of Waterboro wishes to issue commemorative license plates to celebrate that bicentennial; and

Whereas, unless this legislation is enacted as emergency legislation, the bicentennial year will be nearly finished before those license plates can be issued; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Authority. Resolved: That the Waterboro Bicentennial Committee, established by the Town of Waterboro at the annual town meeting, March 9, 1984, under Article 61 and March 8, 1986, under Article 67 of the Town Warrant, is authorized to design, distribute and sell reflectorized, commemorative, bicentennial, simulated motor vehicle registration plates. The committee shall promulgate such rules as it deems appropriate with respect to the design, distribution and sale of reflectorized, commemorative, bicentennial, simulated motor vehicle registration plates. No commemorative plates may be sold, distributed or displayed which are not approved by the committee; and be it further

Use. Resolved: That the commemorative bicentennial plate, as established by this resolve, may be displayed to replace the front registration plate on any motor vehicle registered in this State, except truck tractors, from January 1, 1987, to December 31, 1987. The commemorative bicentennial plate may be displayed on motor vehicles, except truck tractors, registered outside the State, but operated within this State, in the same manner as provided for vehicles registered in this State; and be it further

Fees. Resolved: That the price of the plates shall be determined by the committee. The funds received by the committee from the sale of the plates shall be expended by the committee for the observance of the bicentennial of the Town of Waterboro and for other lawful purposes of the committee.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Resolve shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 4

H.P. 383 — L.D. 505

Resolve, for Laying of the County Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of Oxford County for the Year 1987.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Oxford County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1987 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Oxford County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is hereby granted as a tax on Oxford County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1987:

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized. Resolved: That the following sums, based on the county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by the county during the calendar year 1987 in the specific amounts of expenditures for personal services, contractual services, commodities and capital expenditures for each account in the county budget:

CHAPTER 5

S.P. 137 — L.D. 376

Resolve, Authorizing the Commissioner of Administration to Implement the Plan for Expenditure of the \$6,000,000 Bond Issue to Identify and Correct Asbestos Problems in State Facilities.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 112th Legislature, in its Second Special Session, enacted Private and Special Law 1985, chapter 140, "AN ACT to Authorize a Bond Issue in the Amount of \$6,000,000 to Deal with Asbestos in State Facilities;" and

Whereas, the voters of the State approved the bond issue at the November 4, 1986, statewide election; and

Whereas, the Legislature, as directed by Private and Special Law 1985, chapter 140, must approve the Commissioner of Administration's plan for removal and containment of asbestos in state facilities prior to any expenditure of the \$6,000,000 bond proceeds; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation
