- 1. Identify inconsistencies and shortcomings of the present laws governing Maine guides and develop legislative recommendations to bring them up to date;
- 2. Recommend changes to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife regulations that relate to registered Maine guides; and
- 3. Evaluate a classification system for guides relating to their proficiency and areas of expertise; and be it further

Staff support. Resolved: That staff support shall be requested from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Allocation. Resolved: That the following funds are allocated from revenues dedicated to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

CHAPTER 18

H.P. 1104 — L.D. 1496

Resolve, for Laying of the County Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of Knox County for the Year 1987.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Knox County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1987 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Knox County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on Knox County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1987.
