contamination and possible biological pathways in the environment. The study shall be designed and conducted in consultation and in conjunction with the Maine Agricultural Experimental Station, Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, Department of Environmental Protection, United States Environmental Protection Agency, Cobbossee Watershed District, the National Council for Air and Stream Improvement and Monmouth town officials. In order to minimize environmental contamination with dioxin, research shall be conducted either: (1) In field plots that are currently being amended with dioxin-contaminated sludge, in which case rates or sludge applications shall not be increased for the purposes of this research above those currently permitted; (2) In impermeable containers set out in a field that shall be removed at the conclusion of the experiment; and (3) In pots maintained in a greenhouse. The objective of the study shall be to investigate the environmental fate of sludge-borne dioxin in terms of the uptake of dioxin by agricultural crops and the persistence of dioxin in soil. Information obtained from this study will be made public and subject to peer review. The Environmental Health Unit shall assess the significance of the findings in light of environmental and public health concerns over the landspreading of dioxin-contaminated sludge. The unit shall report annually on its progress and shall report its findings, together with any recommendations to the Legislature, on or before January 1, 1990; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

H.P. 1373 — L.D. 1875

Resolve, to Make Adjustments in the York County Budget.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, York County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, this legislation must be enacted as an emergency measure as York County has already begun its fiscal year and adjustments must be made immediately to the county budget; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolve 1987, chapter 23. Resolved: That Resolve 1987, chapter 23 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Sec. 1. York County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on York County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1987:
