## CHAPTER 76

S.P. 702 — L.D. 1927

**Resolve, to Extend the Interim Reporting Deadline of the Maine Commission to Review Overcrowding at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, during the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature the Maine Commission to Review overcrowding at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute was asked to report to the legislature no later than December 1, 1987; and

Whereas, the commission has found it does not have sufficient time to complete this report; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**Resolves 1987, c. 56. Resolved:** That Resolves 1987, c. 56, 5th ¶ after the title, is amended to read:

**Reports. Resolved:** That the commission shall submit a report with any accompanying legislation to the Legislature by ~~December 1, 1987~~ December 15, 1987, detailing conditions and practices at these 2 mental health institutes and making recommendations directed at alleviating these conditions and detailing results and recommendations of the study of community mental health and support services; and be it further

**Resolves 1987, c. 56. Resolved:** That Resolves 1987, c. 56, 8th ¶ after the title, 2nd sentence is amended to read:

The first part shall be submitted on or before ~~December 1, 1987~~ December 15, 1987, detailing conditions and practices at these 2 mental health institutes and making recommendations directed at alleviating these conditions.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective November 20, 1987.

## CHAPTER 77

S.P. 701 — L.D. 1926

**Resolve, to Continue the Commission to Study the Integration of the Maine State Retirement System with the United States Social Security System.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, during the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature, the commission to study the integration of the Maine State Retirement System and the United States Social Security System was asked to report to the Governor and the Legislature no later than December 1, 1987; and

Whereas, the commission has found it does not have sufficient time to complete this report; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

**Resolves 1987, c. 53. Resolved:** That Resolves 1987, c. 53, 11th ¶ after the title is amended to read:

**Report. Resolved:** That this commission shall prepare and present a report to the Governor and the Legislature no later than ~~December 1, 1987~~ January 15, 1988. This report shall include, but not be limited to:

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective November 25, 1987.
