H.P. 1931 — L.D. 2631

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of Washington County for the Year 1988.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Washington County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1988 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Washington County; taxes apportioned.
Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on Washington County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1988:

PART B

Transfer from surplus. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, sections 252 and 408, funds may be transferred from the surplus account to the contingency account at any time during 1988. This provision shall apply only to 1988. Any transfer shall be reported to the Department of Audit as provided in section 252.

PART C

Loans. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 404, the county commissioners in Washington County during 1988 may obtain loans of money not to exceed \$50,000 for the purpose of asbestos removal in the county, and may cause notes or obligations, with coupons for lawful interest, to be issued for payment thereof at such times and such interest rates as they may determine.

PART D

Civil Emergency Preparedness Agency. Resolved: That, for the fiscal year 1988, the Director of the Civil Emergency Preparedness Agency in Washington County shall serve at the pleasure of the county commissioners.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
