Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Provides funds transferred from the Department of Education and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation.

These funds, which fund a contract with Maine Advocacy Services to advocate for deaf children and children placed outside their homes, are being deappropriated from the Division of Special Education and appropriated directly to Maine Advocacy Services.

These funds, which fund a contract with Maine Advocacy Services to supplement protection and advocacy services to persons with developmental disabilities and mental illness, are being deappropriated from the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and appropriated directly to Maine Advocacy Services.
