CHAPTER 9

S.P. 216 - L.D. 532

Resolve, Allocating the Proceeds of the \$3,000,000 Bond Issue for Land Acquisition, Construction, Repair and Renovation of Public Safety Facilities

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the people of the State have ratified the issuance of bonds for improved public safety facilities; and

Whereas, the proceeds from the sale of these bonds are to be allocated by the Legislature; and

Whereas, immediate implementation of public safety improvements is of paramount importance; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commissioner of Administration to implement expenditure of \$3,000,000 bond proceeds. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Administration may direct and supervise the expenditure by the Department of Public Safety of the \$3,000,000 bond issue authorized by Private and Special Law 1987, chapter 120, which is hereby allocated as follows:

DEPARTMENT OF**

**Waterfowl Habitat Acquisition and
Management**

Capital Expenditures \$35,000

This amount is in consideration of the acquisition of property from the Gray Game Farm for the Dry Mills project referred to in this resolve; the amount of such consideration is determined to be less than the actual fair market value of the 4 acres which will now be used by the Department of Public Safety to house communications equipment and dispatching functions.
