CHAPTER 45

H.P. 1276 - L.D. 1770

Resolve, for Laying of the County Taxes and Authorizing Expenditures of York County for the Year 1989

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, York County has certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes for the year 1989 hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the county; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. York County; taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the following sum is granted as a tax on York County to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied to the purposes of paying debts and necessary expenses of the county as authorized herein, and for other purposes of law, for the calendar year 1989:

Sec. 2. General Fund expenditures authorized. Resolved: That the following sums, based on the county budget filed in the office of the Secretary of State, are authorized as General Fund expenditures by the county during the calendar year 1989, in the specific total amounts of expenditures for personal services, contractual services, commodities and capital expenditures for each account in the county budget:

Sec. 3. Summary. Resolved: That the figures appearing in this resolve represent the total amount of taxes and the total specific expenditures authorized for the calendar year 1989. The following is a summary of revenues and appropriations:

Sec. 4. Resolved: Surplus. That the 1989 budget has a deficit surplus which shall be reduced by application of surplus money received in not more than 4 years ending 1992 as approved by the York County legislative delegation; and be it further

Sec. 5. Resolved: Commissioners' duty. That the York County commissioners are responsible for the application of proper accounting practices in authorizing expenditures under this budget subject to this resolve; and be it further

Sec. 6. Resolved: Transfers. That the York County commissioners shall not withdraw from any line item or subline item of this budget for transfer to another line item or a subline item a sum greater than \$200 during the term of this budget unless approved by the York County commissioners and confirmed by a majority vote of the York County legislative delegation; and be it further

Sec. 7. Resolved: Expenditures. That the York County commissioners shall not authorize payment of bills or expenses against any department line item account of this budget in excess of the budgeted sum including any legal transfers unless approved by the majority vote of the York County legislative delegation; and be it further

Sec. 8. Resolved: Monthly statements. That the York County commissioners shall provide monthly financial operating statements of income and expenses for the county to each member of the budget committee of the York County legislative delegation; and be it further

Sec. 9. Resolved: Allocation. That there is allocated to this budget monies to be received under account #8475 from the Judicial Surcharge Account up to \$40,000 and account #8485 from Community Correction Services Reimbursement up to \$100,000; and be it further

Sec. 10. Resolved: Receipts. That any money received under account #8475 for the Judicial Surcharge Account in excess of \$40,000 and account #8485 for Community Correction Services Reimbursements in excess of \$100,000 shall be collected and set aside in a separate interest-bearing account for allocation and application in the 1990 county budget by the York County legislative delegation; and be it further

Sec. 11. Resolved: Budget for 1990. That the York County commissioners shall prepare and furnish to the York County legislative delegation a preliminary budget for the 1990 fiscal year of the county at a place designated by the chair of the delegation on or before the first Wednesday after Labor Day in September of this year; and be it further

Sec. 12. Resolved: Transfer. That \$151,000 of the designated fund account of the 1988 county budget shall

be transferred to the undesignated fund account of the 1989 county budget.
