- (1) Three hundred thousand dollars for vehicles with 7 or fewer passengers;
- (1-A) One hundred twenty-five thousand dollars, or split limits consisting of \$50,000 per person and \$100,000 per occurrence for bodily injury liability, and \$25,000 for property damage liability for vehicles not under contract with the State, a municipality or a school district for the transportation of students, that are designed to carry no more than 3 passengers behind the driver's seat;
- (1-B) Three hundred thousand dollars for vehicles that are designed to carry 4 to 7 passengers behind the driver's seat, except as provided in subparagraph (1-A);
- (2) Seven hundred fifty thousand dollars for vehicles that are designed to carry 8 to 15 passengers behind the driver's seat;
- (3) One million five hundred thousand dollars for vehicles that are designed to carry 16 to 30 passengers behind the driver's seat; and
- (4) Two million dollars for vehicles that are designed to carry 31 or more passengers behind the driver's seat.

Sec. G-2. Retroactivity. That part of this Act that amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29, section 2708-A, subsection 2, paragraph B applies retroactively to June 1, 1993.

PART H

Sec. H-1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Part.

Sec. I-1. Carrying clause. Any unencumbered balances of Highway Fund allocations in the Department of the Secretary of State, Administration - Motor Vehicle account in excess of those funds necessary to balance the Highway Fund at the end of the fiscal year

ending June 30, 1993, but not to exceed \$250,000, may not lapse but must be carried forward until June 30, 1994 and must be used for upgrading the Bureau of Motor Vehicles information system.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect July 1, 1993.

H.P. 216 - L.D. 284

An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1994 and June 30, 1995

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1993; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Funds allocated or appropriated to the Reserve Fund for State House Preservation and Maintenance may not lapse but must be carried forward;

Sec. J-2. 3 MRSA §905, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. EE, §1, is amended to read:

§905. Contributions

The commission may accept gifts, bequests and federal funds for purposes consistent with the objectives of this chapter. §17858-A. Retirement incentive option

Any state employee, as defined in section 17001, subsection 40, having reached normal retirement age who retires on or after October 30, 1991 and who is restored to service is not subject, for up to 3 years, to the earnings limitations set forth in section 17855. Any such person is entitled to all benefits that the person was entitled to at the time of termination by collective bargaining agreements or civil service laws and rules. The retired state employee's salary must be 70% of the employee's salary at the time of termination. The retired state employee is not a member of the retirement system and therefore may not accrue additional creditable service and is not entitled to any other benefits that accrue to an active member of the retirement system. For any state emplovee who has reached normal retirement age on or before October 30, 1991, the option established in this section must be selected by the state employee by January 31, 1992. For all other state employees for fiscal years 1991-92, 1992-93 and 1993-94 only, the option established in this section must be selected by the state employee within 3 months of the effective date of this section. For any employee selecting this option after June 30, 1993, the portion of the employer contribution that goes to pay for the unfunded liability, retiree health care and administrative costs must be continued and based on the retired state employee's salary at the time of termination.

Sec. L-3. PL 1993, c. 159, §2 is repealed.

Sec. L-4. Application. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 17858-A, a state employee who reached normal retirement age after December 1, 1991 and on or before the effective date of this Part is eligible to elect the retirement incentive option under Title 5, section 17858-A within 3 months of the effective date of this Part.

Sec. L-5. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Part.

Sec. M-1. Carrying balance. Any balance remaining on June 30, 1994 in the General Fund "Public Improvements - Planning - Construction - Administration" program in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services may not lapse but must be carried forward to June 30, 1995 to be used for the same purposes.

Sec. M-2. Transfer to Rainy Day Fund. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1513, subsection 1, after the State Controller officially closes the financial accounts of the State for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1993, an amount not to exceed \$5,377,287 must be transferred to the Rainy Day Fund from the available balance remaining in the General Fund after the deduction of all appropriations, financial commitments or other designated funds.

Sec. N-1. Transfer of funds. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Controller shall deposit to the General Fund as undedicated revenue \$1,500,000 of the scheduled June 1994 payment to Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Maine prior to June 30, 1994.

CHAPTER 416

H.P. 98 - L.D. 140

An Act Concerning the Taking of Sea Urchins

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, more than 25,000,000 pounds of sea urchins having a landed value of nearly \$15,000,000 were harvested in coastal waters during 1992; and

Whereas, the weight and value of the State's sea urchin harvest has increased dramatically since 1987; and

Whereas, sea urchins are now one of the 4 highest valued fisheries in the State; and

Whereas, the health of a fishery and the maintenance of sustainable yields are primary goals of fisheries management; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §§6704 and 6705, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 591, Pt. T, §8, are repealed.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA c. 623, sub-c. II-C is enacted to read:

SUBCHAPTER II-C

SEA URCHINS

Article 1

Licenses

§6748. Handfishing sea urchin license

- 1. License required. It is unlawful for a person to engage in the activities authorized by the license under this section without a current handfishing sea urchin license or other license issued under this Part authorizing the activities.
- 2. Licensed activity. The holder of a handfishing sea urchin license may take sea urchins by hand or possess, ship, transport or sell sea urchins taken by that licensee.
- 3. Eligibility. A handfishing sea urchin license may be issued only to an individual and is a resident license.
- 4. Fee. The fee for a handfishing sea urchin license is \$89.
