**CHAPTER 1**

**H.P. 227 - L.D. 262**

**An Act to Make Additional**  
**Appropriations and Allocations for**  
**the Expenditures of State**  
**Government and Change Certain**  
**Provisions of State Law Necessary to**  
**the Proper Operations of State**  
**Government for the Fiscal Year**  
**Ending June 30, 2001**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

**Whereas,** the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

**Whereas,** certain obligations and expenses will become due and payable prior to July 1, 2001; and

**Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

**PART A**

**Sec. A-1. Supplemental appropriations from General Fund.** There are appropriated from the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001 to the departments listed, the following sums.

**Sec. C-1. Transfer from the Salary Plan program and special account funding.** The Salary Plan program in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services may be made available as needed through allotment by financial order upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor to be used in fiscal year 2000-01 for the implementation of approved upgrades for employees in adult and juvenile corrections in the Department of Corrections who have direct contact with inmates. Positions supported from sources other than the General Fund must be funded whenever possible from those other sources.

**Sec. C-2. Tax revenue maximization.** The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services is authorized to implement tax revenue maximization initiatives under current tax law.

**Sec. C-3. Transfer to Highway Fund un-allocated surplus.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, on or before June 30, 2001, the State Controller shall transfer an amount not to exceed \$500,000 from the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to the unallocated surplus of the Highway Fund.

**Sec. H-3. Report.** The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall report back on a quarterly basis within 30 days of the close of each quarter to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters on all transfers authorized pursuant to section 2.

**Sec. I-1. 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## CHAPTER 2

S.P. 339 - L.D. 1146

### An Act to Give the Legislative Council Discretion in Appointing Members to the Revenue Forecasting Commission

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is important to change the membership of the Revenue Forecasting Committee to provide continuity to the committee; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
