Resolved:** That the Adjutant General shall record a finalized Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions in the land located on the Mount Vernon Road in Augusta that Lucille T. McGuire conveyed to the State by deed dated August 17, 1998 and recorded in Book 5729, page 274 of the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds to comply with special condition #6 of the Department of Environmental Protection Order #L-20153-26/31-A/B-N to the Department of Environmental Protection for the Veterans' Memorial Cemetery.

#### Resolve, to Coordinate and Improve Access To Health Care for Women

Sec. 1. Expansion of capacity in maternal and child health programs.
